Munson by the Numbers:

- 7,500 employees: *Largest Employer North of US 10*
- 8 hospitals
- 63 specialties
- 540,000 residents
- Munson covers 11,177 square miles about the size of Vermont and Delaware combined
- 2023 by the numbers:
 - o 142,000 Emergency Room Visits (55k at MMC)
 - o 33,000 Surgeries
 - o 40,000 Inpatient Admissions
- \$171M in free services & community benefit in 2022



Healthcare Industry Challenges



Expense inflation is outpacing insurance reimbursement, putting pressure on financial sustainability.



Staffing challenges continue, resulting in need for continued focus on recruitment and retention



Insurance companies are driving more care to less costly settings, with more volume in outpatient setting.



Competitors continue to enter the market.



COVID-19 has accelerated adoption of new care delivery models, including home-based and virtual care




Munson Implications

Future State: A New Front Door, More Access to Quality Care






Meeting the Healthcare Needs of the Community Means Primarily Focusing on Primary Care

Claritas 2023, MHA FY22 IP Discharges, NAMCS, KFF, Internal Munson Data





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Regional Care Transformation: A Path to a Better Future

When the plan is complete, patients will experience:

- New front doors: More access and different options for care. (i.e. not just a hospital anymore)
- Efficiency & Convenience: Easier access to preventative care. (i.e. primary care, x-rays, blood draws)
- A more consistent, seamless experience: Less paperwork, better coordination, more virtual tools.
- High-Level Specialty Care: An elevated level of care throughout the region – patients won't need to go downstate for high-level specialty care. (i.e. cardiology; stroke; oncology)



What Does This Mean for the Local Community?

- This transformation is about elevating our services and expanding local access to care, not taking services away.
- For POMH, things will look much the same.
- Inpatient care will still be accessible in every region, including at POMH for appropriate observation level care.
- No anticipated change in EMS volume or patterns related to this plan.
- Improved outpatient access to primary care, more local coverage
- Improved virtual access to urgent care
- More access to specialty services
- Smoother transitions between sites of care

What Does This Mean for the Local Community? (cont)

- Elevates MMC's ability to provide more high-level specialty care and services
- Strengthen Munson Healthcare and Paul Oliver for future viability.
 - This plan keeps our community hospitals open at a time when many rural community hospitals across the country are closing.
 - 163 rural hospital closed nationwide in past 10 years.
 - A record 19 rural hospitals closed in 2020 alone.
